Fig. 1 Number of International Students in Japan (As of each May 1)

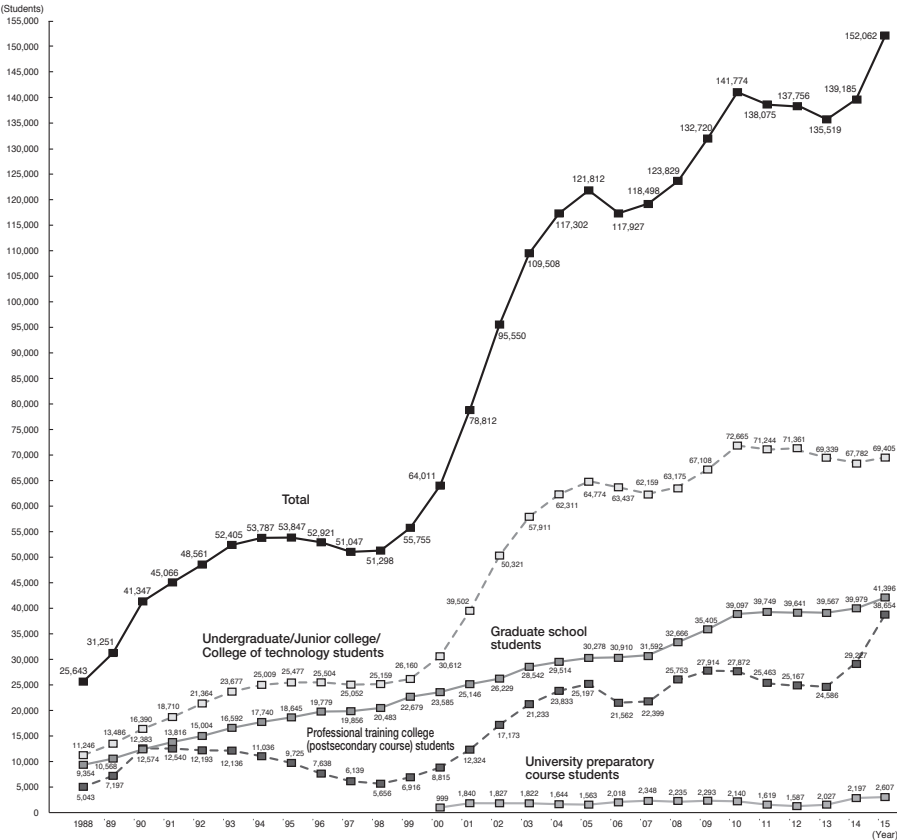


Fig. 2 International Students in Japan by Region of Origin (As of May 1, 2015)
